TCFV is pleased to announce its One In the Movement live, virtual events for 2024! The webinars listed will provide your advocacy staff with help and guidance for the work they do with survivors. All virtual event registration is through Coalition Manager (CM) and will open six weeks prior to the event date. One In The Movement (OIM) is a multi-tier approach to training and delivery of essential resources to new and tenured advocates working in family violence agencies. OIM is available to family violence service program staff, and training is offered free to our TCFV (Texas Council on Family Violence) members. Ensure your staff are trained and encourage them to attend these engagement opportunities:

- » Online access to our OIM webinar library which can be found on our [TCFV Program Advocates](#) webpage. The OIM library contains over 30 webinars in:
 - **Introduction to Advocacy** focused on developing knowledge of family violence systems and meets HHSC (Health & Human Services Commission) training requirements for new advocates.
 - **Enhancing Your Advocacy** opportunities to deepen advocacy skills and learn about nuances and facets of our movement.
- » Live Technical Assistance with TCFV. The Family Violence Services Team holds a recurring monthly zoom meeting, One In the Movement Virtual Office Hours, for a chance to address advocates' technical assistance needs in real-time. Email HKlug@tcfv.org for more information or the Zoom access link.
