#### 1. Overview

This document describes the data elements and file format for the 9 csv files exported from provider tool and then upload in to HHSC FVP website.

- File Name Convention Defines the naming convention for the files uploaded by FV providers
- Client level Information
  - Client demographic information
  - Victimization Information
  - Client Services
- Site level Information
  - Aggregate New Client County information
  - Aggregate New Client Language information
  - Education Presentations
  - Hotline calls
  - Aggregate Data Contains volunteer data along with LGBTQ and Needing Language Services.
  - Performance outcome survey

The sections below define the categories in more detail and the order and data elements for each category.

### 2. File Naming Convention

This section describes the file naming convention for the files to be accepted from sites. There are 9 different categories of data collected in 9 separate CSV files. File name consists of 3 parts separated by underscore.

- HHSC would expect to have a victimization reported for each fiscal year, meaning if a client came for services in August and reported a victimization then that record would need to come over again in September for the new fiscal year assuming client is still getting services

### 5. Support for multiple Shelter (Residential) funding sources

FVNET system will support to accept data from multiple shelter locations in single upload starting FY2018 i.e. Sept 2017. Each location should have different funding source type. There is no change in the csv files format (no new fields added or deleted) except that new funding source value is added. At this point, supporting only one additional funding source though FVNET system can support more, changes need to be coordinated with business and providers.

Main location - HHSC Shelter (RES) Additional location - HHSC Shelter A (RESA)

To accomplish this, the following changes are required.

#### **Providers - Export function**

Providers who have a contract to serve the clients from more than one shelter location (not satellite) then data entry system (Osnium or any other 3<sup>rd</sup> party product) should handle multiple funding sources. Export function should assign the appropriate funding source in all the csv files wherever funding source data is provided currently.

#### **FVNET - Contract setup**

FVNET admin has to setup new contract with additional Shelter funding source for that provider with effective date in HHSC FVNET application.

#### Merge scenario

In an instance where one provider acquiring shelter from another provider, primary provider will have to support multiple shelters using one data entry application/data base. Primary provider

"Export" function should produce one set of 9 csv files for the reporting month for both Shelter locations.

Requirements for the first upload month while uploading the data under primary provider site for the clients getting services from merger shelter:

- Client id's should be unique in the csv files though the data combined from both shelter locations
- Consider all clients from the merger location as 'NEW'. This is important for Client Count
  by Language/County csv files. (Note: If the upload month happens to be start of the FY,
  then all clients from both shelters needs to be reported as new clients)
- Merger site clients should be assigned RESA funding source for the clients receiving shelter services
- Merger site clients can be sent with shelter days alone in Client file for continuing clients (assuming no other services received so no data in Services file for that client)
- TANF data in client file should be reported for merger site clients when uploading first time under acquired site. (Note: If the upload month happens to be start of the FY, then TANF data needs to be reported for both primary and merger site clients)

HHSC FVNET admin should end the contract of the previous provider (merger shelter) and setup new shelter contract for the primary provider with Shelter A funding source.
